A. Background

At its 12th General Assembly, the AACC launched the Churches Campaign against SGBV in Africa to empower Youth leaders (Women and Men) to advocate for an end to SGBV in Africa and contribute to the realization of SDG5 (Gender Equality) and AU Agenda 2063 Aspiration 6 (Aspiration 6: An Africa, whose development is people-driven, relying on the potential of its Citizens.). - 1. Transform toxic gender ideologies, norms, and practices that propagate Genderbased violence
- 2. Promote life-affirming masculinities and femininities to end GBV in Africa
